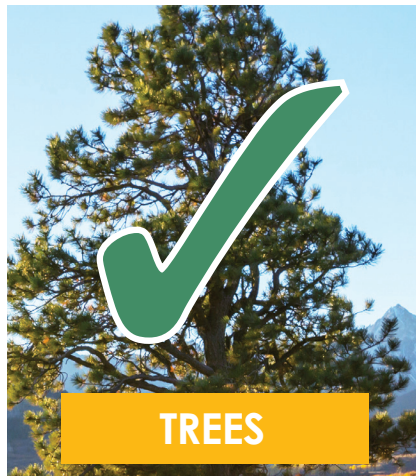


No Grass Watering Effective October 1, 2026



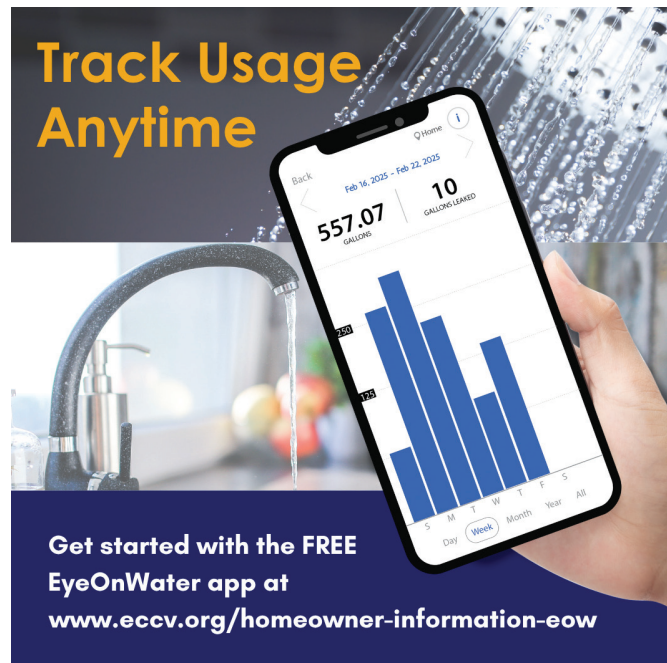
What You Need To Know

Much of Colorado has spent the entirety of 2026 in advanced stages of drought. ECCV's primary water supply, like many others statewide, is well below normal as we enter fall. Mandatory watering restrictions help limit further reductions in our water supplies.

- 💧 Use of outdoor sprinkler systems or any other watering of lawns or grass areas is not permitted beginning October 1, 2026. This restriction will remain in effect until further notice. Customers should plan to drain and winterize systems after September 30.
- 💧 Trees, shrubs, and garden areas may continue to be watered via drip irrigation, soaker hoses, or hand-watering. If hand-watering with a hose, a nozzle with a shutoff valve is required.
- 💧 Permits will not be issued for new sod or grass seed installations until further notice.
- 💧 Customers looking to aerate lawns or grass areas are encouraged to complete this work prior to September 15. Aerating after this date may not allow the lawn to receive enough water once restrictions go into effect October 1.

Two-day per week outdoor watering restrictions will remain in effect through September 30. Please continue to only water on your scheduled watering days (see reverse side). Avoid overwatering. This prevents root systems from deepening ahead of colder weather making grass more susceptible to damage in the fall and winter.
