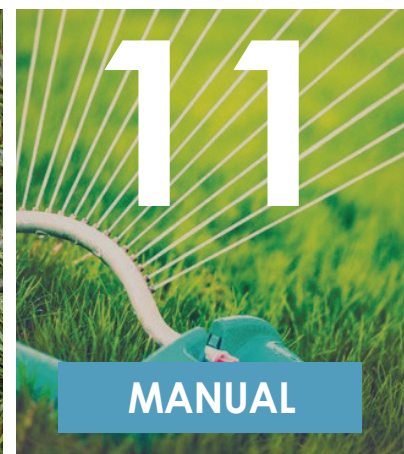
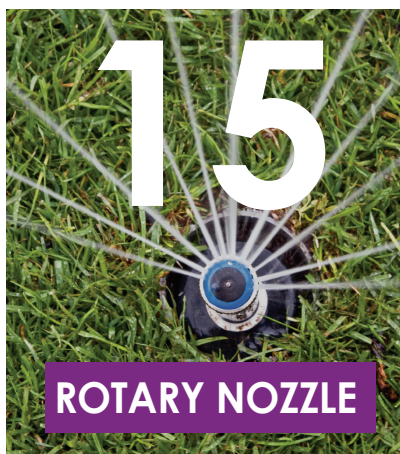


Set Controllers for Efficient July Watering

Recommended Minutes PER CYCLE by Sprinkler Type



July is Smart Irrigation Month

July often delivers some of the hottest and driest stretches of summer. With most of the state already in heightened drought, and water supplies particularly stretched this year, smart irrigation is a must.

💧 Cycle & Soak—Summer heat bakes a crust onto our clay-based soil. It is especially important to give water time to soften that crust on your two weekly watering days. Use the suggested cycle times above and set systems to run three cycles of that duration, with a one-hour break between each cycle. This will maximize the amount of water that enters the soil, and push it deeper to promote stronger roots.

💧 Survive and Advance—A poor year for water supplies and on-going drought make this summer more about survival than style when it comes to your grass. The mandatory two-day per week watering schedule will keep your yard alive. Grassy areas may show signs of dormancy (yellow or brown areas), but will likely remain alive and green-up again when drought conditions subside.

💧 Mow Less—Taller grass shades the topsoil, keeping it cooler and helping it retain water. Either raise mower blades to 3-4 inches off the ground (normal is 2.5-3 inches), or mow less often.
