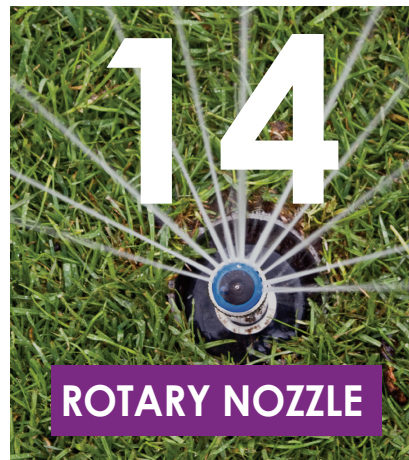


Set Controllers for Efficient June Watering

Recommended Minutes PER CYCLE by Sprinkler Type



Drought Remains Despite May Rain

While storms provided some relief in May, they were not enough to make up for the water supply challenges created by our extremely dry winter. Saving water whenever possible will be important as temperatures start climbing in June.

- Two-Day Schedule Still In Effect**—Please continue to only water grassy areas on your scheduled watering days. This includes front lawns and back yards.
- Don't Overwater**—Stick to the recommended cycle times above when running your system. While it may be tempting to set longer times to really drench yards on your watering days, the clay-based soil in our area takes more time to absorb water. Watering too long will often result in water running off your yard and providing no benefit.
- Drought Pricing**—Water usage of 19,000 gallons or more will be billed at drought pricing rates. Find more information at www.eccv.org/rates-fees-and-charges
- Free Assessments**—Efficient watering doesn't need to be a guessing game. ECCV customers can sign up for free system assessments from a water efficiency pro. They'll help identify any issues that could be wasting water and contributing to higher bills. Check out the graphic on the right for more information.
